

Action 2: Inner source as default



THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular

Article 249 thereof, Having regard to point 6.4 of Commission Decision PV(2001)152 aragraph 12 2001, delegating the powers set out in SEC(2001)1397 thereof,

Whereas
